

# The Eclectic Collection

The eclectic collection can be used for observation and comparison work and also to demonstrate how, when and why advancements in technology have allowed for changes in materials, design and features, with the similarities or striking differences, so revealed.

In addition to tracing over 100 years of motoring heritage with ample tangible evidence and excellent exhibit interpretation, the museum also relates numerous other interesting stories, with many rooted in the local area, including:

A WW1 Commemorative Display

Early Motoring in the English Lake District

A typical 1930s Westmorland garage re-creation

The Campbell Bluebird Exhibition which pays tribute to father and son, Sir Malcolm and Donald Campbell who between them captured 21 World land and water speed records in the Bluebird series of boats and cars.



## Local History

The museum is located on the site of the former Backbarrow Blue Mill, which closed in the early 1980s and is best remembered for the manufacture of the washing additive ultramarine pigment, an optical brightening agent often referred to as Dolly Blue.

The Leven Valley Heritage Centre is an integral part of an amazing overall experience and tells about the iron works, the gunpowder mills and woodland industries.

Other exciting and interesting additions to the museum's display include a series of faithfully re-created 'how it used to be' shop windows; a bookshop, a shoemaker and repairer, a general store, a cycle and accessory centre, a post office, a tea room, a toy and hobby outlet and a boutique, each with authentic contents. The museum also has a splendid collection of historic female fashion clothing and there are dioramas using very realistic mannequins, including a Land Army Girl with a 1940s Fordson tractor and Allied Forces with a WW1, Willys Jeep.



## An Educational Resource

This unique collection of historical artefacts can be effectively used to help build knowledge, skills and understanding, enabling pupils to learn how the past is different to the present and in particular to identify between ways of life at different times.

The Museum has lots of interesting stories which pupils can listen and respond to using various sources of information to help them ask and answer questions. Some of the Primary and Secondary Curriculum subjects we cover are:
